PREFACE

Money to support historical research on literacy is not as visible as it is for other forms of literacy research. This book aims to make more visible—and accessible—information about the foundations, agencies, and organizations that have a history of supporting history-of-literacy research.

In the pages that follow, more than 60 grant and fellowship sources are profiled. By design, we adopted a broad definition of literacy so that the full range of topics that literacy historians study are included. The key words we used to locate funding sources in all databases and publications were: history of ... literacy, reading, writing, spelling, books, audiences, libraries, spellers, chapbooks, textbooks, children's literature, readers, writers, instruction, teaching, publishing, printing, learning, schools, education, hornbooks, and pedagogy.

To ensure comprehensiveness, identifying funding sources involved a six-step process. First, we searched the largest subscription-based funding databases that index the most current funding information:

1. COMMUNITY OF SCIENCE FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES DATABASE
2. SPONSORED PROGRAMS INFORMATION NETWORK (SPIN)
3. ILLINOIS RESEARCHER INFORMATION SERVICE (IRIS)

Second, we searched the American Historical Association's online database of GRANTS, FELLOWSHIPS, AND PRIZES OF INTEREST TO HISTORIANS.

Third, we searched the World Wide Web using the "Advanced Search" capabilities of search engine GOOGLE.

Fourth, we collected the grant and fellowship announcements posted on four listservs from January 2000 through December 2002:

1. HRSIG
2. SHARP-L
3. H-EDUCATION
4. H-ORALHIST

Fifth, we collected the grant and fellowship announcements announced in the CHRONICLE OF HIGHER EDUCATION from January 2000 through December 2002.

Sixth, we made draft copies of this book available for open review and discussion at several professional meetings during the 2002-2003 academic year:

We are aware of two funding sources that did not appear in our search. The first is a scholar's home institution. Most academic institutions sponsor grants and fellowships that are open to on-campus scholars for studying a wide range of topics—including the history of an area like literacy. At our institution, for example, there are open grant competitions several times each year for money to travel, hire a graduate assistant, and purchase documents and materials. Check with your grants office to find similar funding where you work.

The second source that did not appear in our search—except where literacy was specified in the call for proposals—were special collection and center grants. Many libraries and centers host annual grant and fellowship competitions for scholars who must travel to use the resources in their collections. There are rarely topical limitations on these grants and fellowships (i.e., the history of 'literacy' is rarely excluded from the pool of topics considered). To find the funding opportunities for a particular library or center collection, we suggest you search through Book 1 in this series: "Locating Data for Research on the History of Literacy."

Because funding for any scholarly area is constantly evolving, our aim is to update this book periodically. We regret omissions in this first edition; it was not by design, but from "slipping through the cracks" of a thorough search process. Please pass along grant and fellowship sources that should be included in future editions of this book.
